Canada - 'Very sad for me': Northern Sask. chief reacts to alleged bootlegging attempt

Four people are accused of attempting to bring what RCMP are calling a "substantial amount" of alcohol into a northern Saskatchewan First Nation over the weekend. In a release, police said a boat that originated from Barge Landing was stopped Sunday morning after docking at the Hatchet Lake Denesuline First Nation, approximately 700 kilometres north of Saskatoon. The vessel was stopped and searched because RCMP believed a large amount of alcohol for potential resale within the community may have been on board.
